Q	1. If a child is on SoonerStart, can they receive therapy services from additional providers? Example- speech, OT, PT?
A	<i>They can have additional services, but they must have different goals and objectives and should coordinate treatment. Certain CPT codes may have limitations on the locations and/or modifiers that can be billed on the same date; refer to a CPT coding manual or consult a CPT coding specialist for guidance in this area.</i>
Q	2. Would Physical Activity be one of the anticipatory guidance topics that should be addressed and documented for WCC?
A	<i>Yes, it could be included as a guidance.</i>
Q	3. Is there anything special that needs to be done for the Maternal depression screenings for them to be payable? Forms that need to be filled out and kept in chart or just a notation in the child's visit documentation?
A	<i>An evidenced based test/tool needs to be used. It should be notated and scanned into the chart.</i>

Q	1. Just confirming that underinsured patients CANNOT receive VFC's in a clinic setting, only at the Health Dept, RHC or federally qualified health center. Also need confirmation on the price limit for the administration of VFC's.
A	<i>A child is eligible for the VFC Program if he or she is younger than 19 years of age and is one of the following:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Medicaid-eligible</i> • <i>Uninsured</i> • <i>Underinsured [1]</i> • <i>American Indian or Alaska Native</i> <i>Check the fee schedule for price.</i>
Q	2. Does OK Medicaid have the Presumptive Eligibility option?
A	<i>Presumptive eligibility is only available to hospitals in Oklahoma who have entered into agreements with OHCA. Only persons who have been trained by OHCA and have passed a test can process PE applications. To date there are no hospitals in Oklahoma that participate in PE at this time. Hospitals have elected to use the NODOS and eNB-1 processes.</i>
Q	3. VFC vaccines can only be given to uninsured, underinsured, Medicaid patients or American Indian children.
