

PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to 42 CFR § 447.205, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) is required to give public notice of any significant proposed change in methods and standards for setting payment rates for services in the SoonerCare program. The following method change will necessitate an amendment to the Oklahoma Medicaid State Plan. The proposed changes were presented at the Tribal Consultation meeting on May 5, 2020 at 11:00 AM via teleconference.

OK SPA 20-0033, Certified Community Behavioral Health (CCBH) Services Reimbursement, Effective date: July 1, 2020, contingent upon CMS approval.

The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse (ODMHSAS) will seek approval of a State Plan amendment to replace the current process by which new rates for CCBH service providers are established. Currently, the rate for a new CCBH is based on the cost reporting year that ends June 30, using the facility's most recent annual cost report data. Revisions clarify this process by adding a requirement for new CCBH service providers to submit an initial 12-month cost report to set the provider-specific rate and allowing for retroactive adjustment to claims based on the provider-specific rate. Further, provider-specific monthly rates will be updated annually by the Medicare Economic Index (MEI) to reflect changes due to inflation.

The estimated budget impact for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021 will be an increase in the total of \$464,799; with \$143,855 state share. The estimated budget impact for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2022 will be an increase in the total of \$464,799; with \$149,293 state share.
